Marist-Sion vs Sale

Grainger, French and Tattersson all got starts at the top of the order, until Sweeney – who took 5-48 – cut a swathe through the CCS batsmen. Diamond (35) and Floyd (26*) added what proved to be handy late runs. Sale all out for 189 in the 35th over.

Newman won the toss and elected to bat first. The pitch kept the ball low, which meant Newman would have to work hard to put runs on the board. Another solid opening partnership between Callum Hinton (18) and Nick McMahon (34), set up Newman. Middle order batsman Matt Geldard-Ker added to the total, but tight bowling from Tim McPhee (3-18 from 10) and Max Frisby (2-38-10) restricted Newman to 170.

Newman 170 : McMahon 34, Hinton 18 / McPhee 3-18 from 10, Frisby 2-38 from 10.

Ashgrove responded somewhat nervously with the score being 2-15 after 6 overs. However, Tim “the terminator” McPhee came to the crease and partnered captain Michael Wing for a partnership of 82 runs for the 3rd wicket. The partnership was broken with Michael being dismissed for 31. Jack “beefy” Beath joined Tim “the tormentor” and put on 76 to knock off the 170 target. Tim finished up on 82, and Jack Frisby made 38 from 37 balls.

Ashgrove 171-3 : McPhee 82, Wing 31, Frisby 38 / Thacker 2-22 from 7.

Bulleen vs Auckland

SHC won the toss and put Marcellin in to bat. After a promising opening stand from batsmen Domini (20) and Ball – putting on 33 runs. The SHC bowlers began to put on pressure, which resulted in a succession of wickets which fell regularly through the Marcellin innings. Outstanding bowling from Jake O’Callaghan (1-10 from 10) and Seb Salmon (3-24 from 8), as well as Jonny Goosman (2-10 from 5), meant that Marcellin were all out for 116.

The SHC chase began in controversial style, with Marcellin starting with 12 players on the field – which some might say would rival the infamous underarm incident! When the dust finally settled, Rory O’Brien and Alex Wiltshire put on an opening partnership of 58. After some stunning bowling from Sam Bradley (who bowled out young gun SHC batsman Glen Phillips for 1 run), captain Tom Byrne came to the crease. He made an unbeaten 50 runs from 28 balls to lead Sacred to victory in the 23rd over.

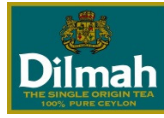
